Regardless of when or how you served it is very possible that you were either injured during service or were exposed to a toxic material. If

you served 2 years or 30 years, I am here to assist you and your friends or family with VA claims. Reach out to me so we can sit and plan your possible benefits with the VA and/or the State of Arizona!

We are planning a few upcoming events. One is a joint event with Legion Post 94 to provide local training for suicide prevention. American Legion national and department goals include each post provide local suicide prevention training, and we are establishing local opportunities for you to receive some basic training of how to identify traits in a veteran of non-veteran that may be thinking of or planning taking their own life. More to follow once we get it all worked out.

Another event is I and a few other service officers from other Legion posts and from Disabled American Veterans (DAV) are putting together a mini seminar on what claims or benefits you or others might qualify for. I have drafted up a session but need to really expand part of it. Once done we will provide the opportunity to attend these sessions at least quarterly until interest declines. Again, more to follow.

YOU are part of the service officer team; you just may not know it. BE THE ONE is linked to service officer work in that it is about helping our fellow veterans and or their families in need. American Legion Riders Report



The Riders of American Legion Post 96 would like to focus on two things in order of importance. Safety #1 and Recruiting #2.

Having witnessed a near fatal motorcycle crash recently during a

fundraiser for another motorcycle accident victim, I thought it appropriate to post these facts and to remind us all to focus on motorcycle safety. There has been a string of serious motorcycle accidents in our area recently.

6,218 motorcyclists were killed in traffic crashes in 2022, which represents 15% of all traffic fatalities.

The fatality rate for motorcyclists was 22 times more than the passenger car occupant fatality rate in 2022, per 100 million vehicle miles traveled.

35% of all motorcycle riders involved in fatal crashes in 2022 were speeding, compared to 22% of all passenger car drivers. Motorcycle riders 21 to 24 years old involved in fatal crashes had the highest speeding involvement at 51% in 2022.

Of the 2,254 motorcycle riders who died in single-vehicle crashes in 2022, 42% were alcohol-impaired.

Motorcycle helmet use increased among motorcycle riders from 64.9% in 2021 to 66.5% in 2022. Similarly, among motorcycle riders with passengers, helmet use increased: 52.1% in 2021 and 58.3% in 2022.

We continue to keep our eyes open for good servant leadership potential members to join our Riders group. Riders who want to help, serve and have some fun as well.

This year's breakfast will be held on Tuesday, September 24 at the Dysart Unified School District Office in the Governing Board Room at 15802 N. Parkview Place. The celebration starts at 8:00 a.m. with breakfast and networking, followed by a program at 8:30 a.m.

Since 2017, Surprise has been designated as a Golden Rule Community by the Arizona Interfaith Movement. We believe events like this encourage partnerships and dialogue between leaders from faith-based and non-profit organizations, and are vital to strengthening our community, building resiliency and supporting all people.

The second annual Surprise Community Legend Awards winners will be announced at the event! As members of the North West Valley Veterans Association, Post 96 is assigned a few weeks a year to retire flags at Sunland Memorial Park. Here is a few photos of the process thanks to Kelly. The NWVVA has five Barn-Yard Burners, used to burn trash in rural environments. They blow air into the 55-gallon barrel that is filled with flags and set afire. After about 45 minutes, the flags are ash and grommets. The barrels are refilled and the process starts again until all the flags in the shed are gone. Flags are collected by all the NWVVA members throughout the year.
